A New Year's Prayer request from Chris Scorah

Each new year, Methodist worshippers covenant themselves to following Jesus afresh. I ask you to join us in covenanting to pray for young people every day this year. Not everyone is available to work with young people, but everybody can pray, and I believe if we want to see God's Kingdom move amongst our young people, then we must start from our knees.

Here are some prayer pointers to help guide you at the beginning of this year.

- A new lockdown means more disrupted education for children. Pray for their mental health, their safety, their family's income and that God will return what's been lost to them. Pray that those who need extra support will get it.
- 2. Pray that young people will make sensible choices and observe the restrictions for the sake of everyone
- 3. **May young people** who cry out, feel the peace and presence of God. May new hymns and psalms of worship be born from the lips of young people out of this time.
- 4. **We pray** that the vaccines will be effective against all strains of the virus.
- 5. **Pray** that God will protect the work of the Hive through these new restrictions practically, financially, spiritually and publicly and that we will soon be able to provide meaningful face to face youth work in his timing.
- 6. **We ask** that young people will encounter the word of God through social media, in education, through those whom He sends in their lives, so that they may come to know Jesus.
- 7. **Pray** for all those locally who work with children and young people: teachers, childcare professionals, youth leaders, Bath Youth for Christ, Hive youth team etc, that this will be a time of advance and inspiration and more will come to join in with reaching out to young people.
